# Jesus enters Jerusalem

When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, [Jesus] sent two of his disciples <sup>2</sup> and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. <sup>3</sup> If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately.'" <sup>4</sup> They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, <sup>5</sup> some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" <sup>6</sup> They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. <sup>7</sup> Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. <sup>8</sup> Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. <sup>9</sup> Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! <sup>10</sup> Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" <sup>11</sup> Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

SECOND LESSON Philippians 2:5–11




# \*LORD'S PRAYER


# **Music Note**

The **offering anthem** is a chorale setting from J.S. Bach's great *St. John's Passion*, which he first directed in a Good Friday service in 1724 at St. Thomaskirche in Leipzig, Germany, 300 years ago this week. Musical groups around the world are performing this Passion throughout 2024. Our **hymn of the day**, #351: *O sacred head now wounded*, is one of Bach's four harmonizations of that Lenten chorale that appear in his massive St. Matthew Passion.

The **communion music** is a 13th-century Christian hymn as set for treble voices by Giovanni Battista Pergolesi (1710-36); he composed it during his final illness from tuberculosis, in a Franciscan monastery in Pozzuli, Italy. It is one of Pergolesi's most celebrated works and achieved great popularity after his untimely death at age 26.

The **sending hymn**, *Senzeni na?* ("What have we done?"), is traditionally sung in South Africa at funerals, in church services and at demonstrations. The song form has endured, while the text sometimes adapts. It is also known as a Xhosa struggle song and as an anti-apartheid song.
