I am writing to update you on the progress of Schafer Hall, say thank you to those who have given to the project and tell you about another opportunity to give.

This week the roof was replaced, and we are receiving bids for the water/mold remediation. What we have found is that the remediation is going to be much costlier than replacing the exterior layers of roofing. Our first bid for the remediation is \$30k and we are waiting for other bids to come in. On top of that work, we still have the cost of remodeling and refurnishing the room.

If you have noticed our thermometer in the Portico, you will see that it is "getting hot in here." Of the \$50k we were hoping to raise, thus far with very generous gifts we have reached \$38k. I say a BIG THANK YOU to all those who have given online or by check and to all those who returned alms jars on Easter. If you haven't returned your alms jar, please do. We have come a long way yet are still short of the mark.

I was asked after church recently what was our giving goal and how can we get there. I told the member that we were about \$12k short. They then said they would match additional gifts up to \$5,000 to get us to our goal!

So, people of God, members of St. Paul's I am calling on your generosity once again. If you haven't given to the Schafer Hall roof, remediation and remodeling project please consider giving. No gift is too small. Each gift will help us move closer to our goal and make Schafer Hall a place we can enjoy for years to come.

Again, thank you to all those who have given so generously. We are almost there!!!
